## Current Worship Series - Holy Interruption

The resurrection was not a gentle spiritual idea - it was a disruptive, holy interruption. Locked doors flew open. Doubters touched wounds. Strangers gathered around the table. Communities reoriented their lives. The early disciples were interrupted so deeply by the risen Christ that they could not return to the lives they had beforehand.

In this Easter season, we will ask: if resurrection is true, what in our lives cannot possibly stay the same?

From fear to courage, from isolation to community, from certainty to courageous witness - Christ's resurrection still interrupts us.
